- Understanding of the importance of the board's role in supporting fundraising and revenue development efforts; ideally, the ability to contribute both personally, and through outreach to personal and business networks.
- The ability to commit to board meetings, committee meetings and board events, some of which may occur during business hours. The average monthly commitment to board related activities is approximately 6-8 hours (or more, if in a leadership role or serving on a Committee).
- The desire to work within a group of dedicated community leaders in an open, honest and constructive manner for the benefit of our users and in support of our staff.
- Be resident in the City or the District of North Vancouver.

Term of Appointment: Directors are expected to commit to an initial term of term of up to three years, with eligibility for re-appointment to a maximum of two consecutive terms (six years in total).
